

Completed in 2019, the restoration of Pelican Golf Club in Belleair, Florida has brought the course back to and beyond its original glory.

The project team was aiming to restore the 'Golden Age' aspects of the course, which was originally designed by **Donald Ross** and opened in the 1920s. The club was formerly known as Belleview Biltmore Golf Club.

Though a full restoration was deemed unfeasible after research due to a lack of historic records of the property, Beau Welling was looking to create a course that is reminiscent of Ross's era and included many of his principles and styles.

"At Pelican Golf Club we had the opportunity to create a modern interpretation of a 'Golden Age' golf course. The course is set in a beautiful park-like setting that we have updated, but our primary focus had been on recreating many classic stylistic elements while increasing overall strategy and playability."

Welling has created a modern classic course that is both challenging and fun to play, with many options and risk-reward scenarios. He retained the original "smart" routing and the club took advantage by promoting itself as walking only with caddies

– unique to the Tampa area.





















Papago Golf Course, owned by the City of Phoenix, AZ, was long considered the finest public golf course in the state. It was designed by well-known and esteemed golf course architect William Francis (Billy) Bell, who learned his craft from his father, William Park Bell. They collaborated on many highly rated California courses. Perhaps best known among the nearly one hundred courses to Billy's credit is Torrey Pines in San Diego. He also designed Tucson Country Club and Wickenburg Country Club.





For over two decades, Arizona Grand Golf Course (formerly known as Phantom Horse Golf Club) has supported the rich tradition of the game with its unique links course, featuring panoramic views of the surrounding desert landscape.

Dramatic elevation changes and breathtaking mountain vistas highlight the diverse and challenging par 71 layout.

Designed by Forrest Richardson and Brad Bartell, the course complements the grandeur of the spectacular Sonoran Desert with stunning conditions and a service staff committed to creating exceptional experiences for players of all ability levels.

The course has been awarded Four Stars "Best Places to Play" from Golf Digest and was ranked in the Top 35 Courses in Arizona by The Arizona Republic.























Tom Fazio is a master when it comes to designing unique and dramatic golf environments that are as challenging as they are beautiful. A true artist, he was blessed with a wonderful canvas at Black Diamond on which to paint a grand masterpiece. And that he has done, creating a magnificent complex of 45 holes of golf, including the 18-hole Quarry and Ranch Courses and a 9-hole layout named the Highlands Course that's as worthy of accolades as the first two courses.

The Quarry Course has 13 outstanding golf holes and 5 incredible ones. Holes 13 through 17 play across and around the rims of two canyons up to 80 feet deep and may well be the most spectacular holes of golf this side of Pebble Beach. Included in this five-hole odyssey are two dramatic drop-shot par-threes, two awesome par-four's and one great risk-reward par-five which yields eagles and birdies, as well as double and triple bogeys. On a cool morning, the 368-yard, par-four 15th hole is truly a slice of heaven.





Of all the great Orlando golf courses in the Central Florida area, **Steve Smyer's** creation at Southern Dunes may be the most unique. Central Florida has an abundance of courses that typify the style generally found in the state, however, not very often can locals and tourists find a course in Florida that has such unique topography to it. This dramatic hillside layout stretches to over 7,200 yards and features 100 ft. of elevation change, large undulating greens, massive high lipped bunkers, Dunes that are covered with high grasses and ornamentals, which form borders that tumble with the terrain.











Five sets of tees provide all skill levels to enjoy risk/reward opportunities through extensive mounding and strategically placed bunkers. The par-3 holes play down-hill giving golfers beautiful views of greens and present holes that truly have distinction.


There are five par-4 holes that stretch more than 420 yards from the back tees and three that play less than 380 yards long.

The shorter ones make golfers play smart off the tee and with the approach, while the longer ones call for some muscle to get the ball on the putting greens in regulation. The par-5's allow for some mistakes from the tee box, however, these holes offer tough risk reward opportunities for the player trying to get the ball on the putting surface in just two shots.















Southern Dunes G&CC, located in Haines City, has become the place well known to locals as challenging design, but fair and fun to play time and time again. It's a layout that penalizes poorly executed shots and one that rewards sound golf. The Dunes, as many call it, is a true golfing experience that offers 18 holes of remarkable golf and is a worthwhile stop the next time you visit the Orlando area.





















Mystic Dunes Golf Club is renowned as one of the most unique courses in all of Florida. Designed by Champions Tour Player and NBC golf analyst **Gary Koch** it is rated 4-1/2 Stars by Golf Digest magazine.

With 80-foot elevation changes, rolling sand dunes, mature oaks and large wetland areas, the par 72 course offers two distinctly different nines. The "low country" style back nine is reminiscent of classic Carolina courses, meandering through native wetlands and marsh areas, bordering oak and cypress forests. The front nine features the characteristics of a British Isles links course, with extensive perimeter mounding and pot bunkers, and lush, rolling fairways.

The course also includes several signature holes, 36 bunkers, two holes with surrounding water and two holes as designated island holes.

The course features a 60,000 sq. ft. practice facility including a driving range, chipping and putting greens and practice bunkers. And the clubhouse features a great grille room and an extensive Pro Shop, where you'll find the latest in golf fashion and equipment for both men and women.




































Indian Hill. There is no better place for the Golf Purist to call home as it's centrally located and easy to get to yet surprisingly secluded. The beautifully groomed grounds and average round times of 3.5 hours or less make Indian Hill the best choice for golfers to call home. Designed by Robert Jack Ross, Indian Hill is a par-72 private course that features 18-holes and is 6,513 yards. It was founded in 1899 as a nine-hole course named Maple Hill Golf Club. The course expanded to 15 holes in 1912 and added the three final holes in 1920 after buying nearly 16 acres of neighboring farmland.





Jack Frost National Golf Club embraces the Pocono Mountains with all of its magnificent vistas and elevation changes.

Different than most mountain courses, Jack Frost National also provides wide fairways, easily identified target areas, few uneven lies and no blind shots.


Designed by **Terry LaGree** and considered a "large golf course" spanning over 7,200 yards, and more than 200 acres, the course covers magnificent terrain, beautiful landscapes and offers striking vistas and views. The course is located on the crest of Jack Frost Mountain that encompasses an elevation of 2000 ft and the natural Oak Forest highlights the movement of each golf hole.



Conveniently located in the beautiful, rolling hills of Purcellville, Loudon Golf & Country Club is one of the leading private Clubs in Northern Virginia.

The club features an 18-hole championship, Par 72 golf course. The original routing of the course opened in 1927, and it is now played over the majority of the back nine. The land for the newest nine holes was acquired, the course designed by Ed Ault and Al Jamison, and construction was completed in 1961. This is the current front 9. While these eras of design were different, the integrity of the course is very much rooted in precise shot making to rolling fairways and into small green complexes. The course measures 6,583 yards from the championship tees and it is challenging and enjoyable for golfers of all skill levels.

The Club's golf activities include a full schedule of tournaments and special events. Loudoun Golf & Country Club is also pleased to participate in using the PGA of America/US Kids Golf Family Tees for Junior Golfers on the entire 18-holes.































Located in the rolling countryside of Great Falls, Virginia, River Bend Golf and Country Club is one of the premier private membership clubs in the Washington, D.C. area. Known for many years for its challenging, beautifully maintained golf course, River Bend offers a full range of recreational and social amenities including golf, tennis, swimming, fitness & wellness, dining, catering, and event planning. Junior programs abound with golf and tennis clinics and lessons, kids' fitness programs, a competitive swim team and summer camps. Everyone in the family is involved, with a full special event and social calendar.

River Bend has a distinctive character, combining excellent facilities and attentive service with a family-friendly and comfortable atmosphere. That atmosphere is a direct result of the fundamental policy at River Bend since its founding in 1961, that the Club exists for the use and enjoyment of its members. This policy is also reflected in the limits on the total number of memberships and on the number of memberships with full golf privileges, both of which are maintained at levels far below those of most other golf and country clubs. Because of the small size of its membership, River Bend's facilities and recreational programs are easily accessible to the members.

River Bend Club features a championship eighteen-hole golf course and state-of-the-art golf practice facility. Originally designed by **Steven R. Smyers**, in 2011, the course was redesigned and renovated by renowned architect **Keith Foster**.






















The Bear is every bit the animal it was when Jack Nicklaus first unleashed the course on June 17, 1985. Celebrated as one of the toughest 18 holes in Michigan, The Bear was ranked as the 18th toughest course in America, according to Golf Digest. This beautiful course offers the best of Traverse City golf and regularly stands out as a top golf course in Michigan. Nicklaus' signature design features Scottish terraced fairways, tiered greens, deep grassy roughs, moguls and mounds, and deep pot bunkers. With rolling land, trees, lakes, streams, fruit orchards, and a variety of wildlife, The Bear features a mixture of different elements golfers rarely see on one course. This is northern Michigan golf at its finest.





















Course Architect

Spruce Run, the Resort's original resort course, began as a nine-hole Public Golf Course and was expanded to 18 holes in the 1970s. The course was redesigned as a 6,741-yard par-72 course in 1979 by former University of Michigan Golf Coach **William Newcomb** and renamed The Resort Course. It was given the name Spruce Run in 1992 as a reflection of the numerous spruce and fir trees that line its fairways and greens. Spruce Run was modified to a par-70 course during


More forgiving than The Bear, Spruce Run is fun to play while retaining some of the challenging elements for which it was renowned as host to the Michigan Open.

the development of The Wolverine.

































Located in Traverse City, LochenHeath is one of Michigan's highest ranked private golf clubs and has been named on *Golf Digest's* "Best in State" list since its opening.

LochenHeath is of Scottish origin. "Loch" is translated as lake and "Heath" is a native grass. The property, a scenic bluff overlooking East Grand Traverse Bay in the upper Lower Peninsula of Northern Michigan, was once a cherry orchard owned and operated for over 75 years by the Maitland

family. The course, designed by **Steve Smyers**, hugs the shore of Grand Traverse Bay, offering sweeping views of its crystal blue waters.

LochenHeath is one of only a small handful of Northern Michigan golf courses crafted in the Scottish links style. The 7,280-yard-course features rolling terrain, wide-open fairways, and deep, well-placed bunkers. The design is a player favorite both for the unmatched beauty of the surrounding area and as a challenge for golfers who want to test their prowess in the sport.





The inspiration for the South Course was born out of a desire to present the guests at Arcadia Bluffs with a golfing experience unlike that of any other golf destination in America. To present players with the opportunity to play a golf course that would stand as a testament to the challenges and emotions experienced only at a few select classic private courses from golf's earliest days. The objective for architect **Dana Fry** would be to design a golf course by strategically positioning a collection of elements, serene in their appearance, ultimately creating a veil of simplicity over the complexity of the challenges that await. It is this aspect of enduring classic design that both confounds and excites golfers, leaving them with an elevated anticipation to return.

The 311-acre parcel was assembled just one mile south of the existing Arcadia Bluffs course that has enough topographic relief to allow for varying lies, contains sandy soils for firm and fast conditioning, is square in configuration to allow for a well-mixed variety of hole directions, and is walkable. The routing of the South Course is two distinct nine-hole loops, each containing a balanced mix of north, south, east, and west facing holes. Golfers will notice the distinct lack of trees on the course, making the ever-present wind a consideration and affording long range views across the property.





























Built on 240 acres that was a mix of apple and cherry orchards, and densely wooded sections, construction of Arcadia Bluffs began in 1997 and was completed in 1999, with the clubhouse opening July 4th and the golf course to limited play on Labor Day. Although the land was spectacular by itself, many of the mounds and native areas were sculpted and shaped into their present form as the holes were routed by architect **Warren Henderson**. As the


course began to emerge it was clear that this was going to be a special place. Throughout the years over half of the green complexes have been modified, offering a more enjoyable and playable course with an improved pace of play. Many of the original sod-walled bunkers have been converted into native bunkers, but those that remain are rebuilt every 3-5 years.





Designed by the legend **Sir Nick Faldo**, the Wilderness Club championship golf course is recognized as the #42 ranked golf course in America by Golf Digest (June 2019) and #1 in Montana by Golf Weekly (March 2019). With spectacular views and impeccable conditioning, it is truly an unforgettable experience.

The surrounding mountains provide a stunning backdrop for many shots you'll have throughout the day while the bunkers and water hazards offer eye candy within the bounds of the course. The course starts with a couple of warm-up holes and then is really amped up through the middle of the round before dialing back a bit in preparation for the stunning finishing holes. The conditioning of the bluegrass fairways and bentgrass greens is excellent and the setting will remind you of something you would find outside of Coeur d'Alene, ID. Fescue lines the outside of the fairways and provides a variety of different lies and challenges. The Wilderness Club is comfortably in the discussion when considering Montana's best courses and offers some of the best, most memorable, holes in the state.









While Crestmont Country Club excels in all areas of private country club services, what is recognized as Crestmont's feature attraction is its dynamic and challenging par 72 championship golf course. At 6,886 yards from the back tees, with 93 sand bunkers, multiple water hazards and ultra-fast, undulating greens, the course is a genuine challenge for the best of golfers. In 2008, Crestmont was a qualifying venue for a field of 52 players vying for a spot in the United States Senior Open and yielded only three scores below par. Yet, Crestmont membership consensus is that the course is eminently "fair" and so tactically interesting that it can be played regularly throughout the season without ever losing the interest and enthusiasm of its players.

Crestmont still possess the original architectural drawings of famous Scottish course designer **Donald Ross** for each championship hole (vintage 1927). And in 2008 we completed a multi-year, multi-million dollar "restoration" project designed to return the course to Donald Ross's original, spectacular vision. As a result, Crestmont members play regularly on immaculate tee boxes, fairways and putting greens manicured to traditional world-class specifications.



One of the most spectacular and scenic courses in New England, the Sunday River Golf Club is a **Robert Trent Jones**, **Jr.** design featuring 18 breathtaking holes that wind through the Maine woods and over dramatic elevation changes in a stunning mountainside setting. Overlooking the Sunday River Valley with the Mahoosuc range towering above, the course follows the natural topography of the landscape while striking the perfect balance between challenge and playability.





The spectacular grounds of New Hampshire's Mount Washington Resort features 18-hole and 9-hole championship golf courses, on the western flanks on NH's Presidential Mountain Range. The 18-hole Mount Washington Course, with New Hampshire's spectacular Presidential Mountain Range as a backdrop, was designed by legendary Scottish Architect **Donald Ross** and was completed in 1915. This Par 72, 7004-yard course has hosted four New Hampshire Opens and the prestigious New England Open Championship in September 2010.

Reopened on August 1, 2008, the Mount Washington Course has been restored to Donald Ross' original plans by noted golf course architect Brian Silva, including bunkers crafted in a classic flair and infinite varieties of recovery shots in the closely cropped areas around the putting greens. The par-five 11th hole and the par-three 5th hole feature stunning views of the Omni Mount Washington Hotel and surrounding mountains.



Tillinghast, who is regarded as one of the finest golf course architects of all time. His genius can be found on other fine courses such as Winged Foot Golf Club, Baltusrol Golf Club, Philadelphia Cricket Club, and the San Francisco Golf Club. Dating back more than 100 years, the Valley Country Club has a deep-rooted history in Northeast Pennsylvania. The club can trace its roots back to 1906 when a corporation was formed by five Hazleton area businessmen named the Hazleton Country Club. The sole purpose of this organization was for the promotion of social recreation and the encouragement and stimulation of an interest in cycling, horse riding, driving, golf, tennis and other outdoor sports.

























MANASQUAN RIVER

GOLF CLUB



Manasquan River Golf Club is a private member-owned golf club located on the eastern shore of New Jersey in the Borough of Brielle. In 1922, Manasquan River Golf Club purchased 150 acres of farmland and rolling hills that included 1800 feet of waterfront property along the Manasquan River. The property, part of the Old Squan Highlands, includes the highest point on the Atlantic Seaboard from Atlantic Highlands to Florida. Golf course architect Robert White was commissioned to build nine holes in the pastures and swampy meadowlands along the river, which opened for play in 1923. Then in 1926, the second nine holes opened for play in the elevated woodlands and laurel-laden ravines overlooking the river. Manasquan River Golf Club remains a course with a flavor unlike any other at the Jersey shore, presenting two distinct faces.
























Championship Course at Trump National

Previously ranked as one of the Top 3 New Golf Courses by *Golf Digest* in 2016, the Championship Course offers a magnificent golf experience.

Home of the 2017 KitchenAid Senior PGA Championship, the Championship course at Trump National is the only course in Washington D.C., Maryland and Virginia with large scale Potomac River frontage.

Designed by **Tom Fazio**, the course was built specifically for world-class golf. Measuring 7,693 yards, each hole has been meticulously built to take unprecedented advantage of the Potomac River from both a visual and playability perspective.









he Golf Club at Lansdowne, known as one of the most prestigious private clubs in the Mid-Atlantic region, provides members and guests with an ideal environment for golf and leisure. The Club offers 45 holes of world-class golf, a 43,000 square-foot clubhouse, indoor and outdoor pools, complete health and fitness amenities and the award-winning Spa Minérale. The two championship 18-hole courses were designed by Robert Trent Jones Jr. and Greg Norman. The key to success on the RTJ course is the ability to accurately judge the impact of elevation changes. For example, the par-3 13th hole features a 50-foot drop from tee to green, requiring a carry over a creek that runs across the front of the green, as well as a stone wall that dates back to the 1700s.

This course provides mental challenges with risk-reward holes and a tee-to-green carry over water on the par-3 17th, as well as physical tests with a pair of classic, three-shot par-5s. While friendly, the strategic layout will test the skills of all playing levels, rewarding each with a memorable round.
